Question and Answer

October 6, 2020:

- Q1. The advertisement states, that in Section 12, the percentage estimated for each evaluation discipline should not be less than 5%. What should be entered for sub-consultants who will perform less than 5% of work?
- A1. The requirement that the percentage estimated for each evaluation discipline be not less than 5% has been eliminated. The consultant's proposal may reflect any percentage for each evaluation discipline identified; however, the evaluation disciplines must total 100%. As a reminder, the percentages for the prime and sub-consultants must total 100% for each evaluation discipline. An addendum will be issued today and the deadline will not be extended due to this change.

October 7, 2020:

- Q2. Can a consultant who was involved with the design of the project, be listed as a prime consultant or a sub-consultant for the Construction Engineering & Inspection (CE&I) of the same project?
- A2. For construction, engineering, and inspection (CE&I) contracts, consultants who were responsible for any final design services on a project will not be permitted to perform CE&I services on that project.

October 12, 2020:

Q3. In the Section 12 table, consultants are to identify the Evaluation Disciplines, their respective percentage of the overall contract and the prime's and sub-consultants' percentages for each Evaluation Discipline as well as for the total contract. If a prime wants to identify a sub-consultant whose services will only be necessary if certain contingencies arise, how is that reflected in the Section 12 table? Does the consultant just

assign an arbitrary percentage to the sub-consultant or show "TBD" or "if needed" in the table.

A3. When a sub-consultant will be needed only when certain contingencies arise and will not be used otherwise, do not assign a percentage of the Evaluation Discipline or contract to that sub-consultant in the Section 12 table. Instead, indicate "if needed" in the appropriate locations. Additionally, the consultant should address this in Section 19, Approach and Methodology.
